Year C, First Sunday in Lent, March 6, 2022

Deuteronomy 26:1-11; Psalm 91:1-2, 9-16; Romans 10:8b-13; Luke 4:1-13

“Once you enter the land that GOD, your God, is giving you as an inheritance...take it over and settle down,” Deuteronomy 26:1, The Message

Meister Eckhart was a 13th cent. German theologian, philosopher, and mystic. He taught: “When the soul wants to experience something, she throws out an image in front of her and then (the soul) steps into it.”

Consider that our God given gift of imagination is our divine inheritance. Jesus describes it in images of “the kingdom of heaven, Luke 17:21; a “treasure hidden in a field” or “a pearl of great price,” (Matt. 13:44).

Lent is the time to “look within” and assess the state of our souls. Through the spiritual practices of quietness, prayer and sacrifice, the Holy Spirit of Lent can open our imaginations. We will “catch” images of a “Kingdom of Heaven” sized capacity for love and generosity that brings life and hope.

“Hidden Treasures” will be seen as the infinite ability to be patient and gentle, especially with *ourselves*. We will realize we are truly “pearls of great price,” worth dying for as Jesus did over 2000 years ago.
