Centering Prayer

Centering Prayer is a method of prayer and spiritual practice with no goal other than to offer, by faith, our *self* to God and consent to God’s presence and work within us. Centering Prayer is a practice of intentional silence, in which we let go of the noise and sounds of the outside world and the “inner noise” of our mind’s wandering thoughts. Centering prayer invites us to communion with God beyond **thoughts, words, emotions, sense experiences, or acts**. It is *not* something exotic and unattainable. It is achieved by *practice*.
